President & CEO's *Message*

Close to 700 Jewish American athletes, coaches, and other volunteers will have the honor of marching into Movistar Arena in Buenos Aires on December 28 for the Opening Ceremony of the 15th Pan American Maccabi Games.

When they do, it will help kick off one of the Jewish world's biggest family reunions, despite most of the 2,500 participants not knowing one another beforehand. The unique combination of Jewish community and sports represented in the arena that night and over the course of the ten days we will spend together will give everyone a sense of shared connection and purpose. Throw in the warmth, energy, and pride of our Argentinian hosts and the other Latin American delegations, and you've got a reunion for the ages.

Starting in 1963, the Pan Am Maccabi Games take place every four years in a different Latin American country: Brazil, Chile, Mexico, Uruguay, Venezuela, and, again this year, Argentina. Modeled off the Maccabiah in Israel, the Pan Am Maccabi Games (along with the European Maccabi Games) represent a more intimate opportunity for elite Jewish athletes from around the world to gather and compete in the years between the Maccabiah.

That intimacy is evident in a number of ways. For example, while athletes at the Maccabiah are spread across Israel, everyone will be staying entirely in Buenos Aires and competing (almost entirely) in one of three athletic hubs in the Jewish community: Cissab, Hacoaj, and Hebraica.

As they do, they will be creating memories and friendships – with American teammates and new family members from around the world – that will last a lifetime.

And when we find ourselves in Buenos Aires in late December, we will be keeping a close eye on another competition: the Weitzman Challenge.

Established in the Fall of 2021, the Weitzman Challenge was a game-changing opportunity launched by shoe designer, philanthropist, and Maccabi USA alum Stuart Weitzman. A little over a year later at the end of 2022, we had raised an incredible \$2.5M, which was

generously matched by Stuart with a gift of \$4.5M, launching a \$7M endowed scholarship fund for athletes in financial need.

Moved by the progress we had made as a community, Stuart extended the match to the end of 2023, giving us additional time to raise the final \$500K of the match leading to Stuart's own final \$500K contribution.

As we approach December 31, we are leaving no stone unturned in our pursuit of the full amount. We invite you to join the hundreds of Maccabi USA supporters who have stepped up to give to the Weitzman Challenge. If you have already given to the Challenge, thank you! If you have the means to double down on your investment in future Jewish athletes, please do so.

For those who have yet to contribute, time is running out to add your name. Please join us as we help ensure the financial accessibility of the Maccabiah for future generations!

We also encourage you to follow the excitement of the Games on the various social media channels @maccabiusa @buenosaires2023_, and @faccma_argentina.

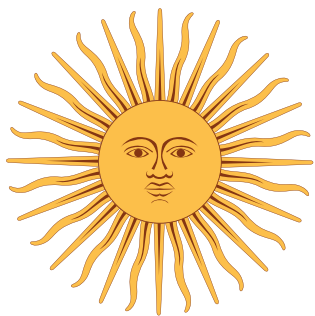

I am excited and looking forward to chairing the European Maccabi Youth Games (EMYG) in London in 2024. I love being involved with Maccabi USA, the people, the mission, and the spirit. The EMYG will be my fourth Maccabi event, and I am thrilled to be involved once again. My journey started at the 2017 Maccabiah as the judo team manager after a friend, World Champion and Olympic medalist, Yarden Gerbi, recommended that I get involved, and current Maccabi USA Vice President Lou Moyerman welcomed me to the team. I was the judo chair and team manager again in 2022, and this year I will serve as the Masters division lead manager for the upcoming Pan American Games in Buenos Aires, Argentina.

With the help of Mackenzie Mager's leadership from the Maccabi USA professional staff, we are working diligently on entry forms, building an organizing committee and speaking with potential sports chairs and coaches. Together, we want to make the team's experience as outstanding as possible!

The games and accommodations will take place July 30-August 6, 2024, at the University of Hertfordshire, Hatfield which is 25 minutes from Central London. We anticipate taking upwards of 250 athletes plus additional staff and volunteers to the Games, and are still determining which sports and teams the USA delegation will bring. Athlete

categories will include U18 (born between 1/1/2006 – 12/31/2007) and U16 (1/1/2008 – 12/31/2009.)

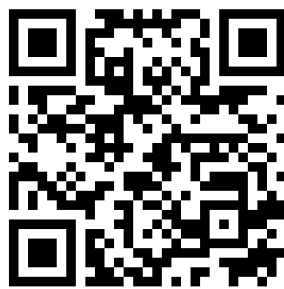


The **RE-MATCH** is on in **2023!**



Last year, Maccabi USA alum Stuart Weitzman made a gift of \$4.5M to match the \$2.5M we raised to start the Stuart Weitzman Scholarship Fund. The initiative was such a success that Stuart generously offered a RE-MATCH: If we can raise \$500,000 before December 31, 2023, he will match it with another \$500,000 to his namesake fund.
