President & CEO's Message

As we look back on the last year, it is clear that Maccabi USA's mission is as critical as it's ever been. The heinous attacks of October 7th and the existential fight that has followed in Israel's South and now North and the battle against antisemitism in the US and around the world, has increased the importance of Maccabi USA's efforts to build pride and connections through sports: within the American Jewish community, with other members of the global Jewish Diaspora, and certainly with Israel and Israelis.

The importance of our mission was clear in Buenos Aires in December as the Maccabi Movement gathered for the Pan Am Maccabi Games. And it was clear in London in July as we gathered for the European Maccabi Youth Games.

At both Games, Maccabi USA had the second largest delegation after our wonderful hosts FACCMA and Maccabi Great Britain, respectively. In Argentina, the US delegation had its own hotel, with transportation provided to each of the competition venues. In England, the Games were situated on a college campus north of London, with all delegations staying, eating, and competing (aside from a handful of sports taking place nearby) in one location. The setup lent itself to opportunities for meaningful connection across the various countries and cultures represented, both on and off the field.

And much as it was at the Pan Am Maccabi Games in Argentina, it was particularly meaningful to be joined by a delegation of athletes and managers from Israel. The power of their participation was evident from the start of the Games in England. The Israeli delegation marched into the opening ceremony with pride and enthusiasm – and were promptly joined by athletes from the other delegations in the room who marched right along with them. The same was true a few minutes later as all those assembled belted out Hatikvah as if to collectively say Am Yisrael Chai – the People of Israel Live!

The same was true in Buenos Aires – as thousands of people in Movistar Arena gave the Israeli delegation a standing ovation, shed some tears, and sang the Israeli national anthem.

And the same will certainly be true next summer in Israel at the 2025 Maccabiah. Maccabi USA will send our largest delegation ever to these quadrennial Games and what will be the largest delegation of American Jews to travel to Israel since October 7th. There is, of course, significant cost to make this possible and we appreciate everyone in the Maccabi USA community who can contribute to ensure we meet the moment, providing a life-changing experience to our largest-ever delegation and, in the process, a much-needed boost to the economy of Israel.

Next year's Maccabiah will be a display of solidarity and unity unlike any in the 90+ year history of the Games and a reminder that the mission of Maccabi USA – to build Jewish pride and promote support for Israel, Zionism, and Jewish continuity through athletic, educational, and cultural experiences for participants of all ages – is as relevant and critical as at any point in our history.

Shanah Tovah u'Metukah – may it be a happy and healthy year for everyone in the Maccabi family and may the new year see the swift and safe return of the hostages.



Remembering October 7th



This month Israel marked the one-year anniversary of the horrifying attack on October 7th, the resulting hostage crisis, the war on multiple fronts, and a rise of anti-Israel, anti-Zionist, and antisemitic rhetoric and acts worldwide. Through unspeakable tragedy, Israel has stood strong, and the Jewish People globally have rallied in

support of our ancient and modern Homeland.

For more than a century our Maccabi Movement has represented the strength and resilience of the Jewish People through sports. Modeled on the image of Nordeau's "Muscular Jew" to stand proudly in the face of European antisemitism in the 19th Century the name Maccabi has carried the heroic legacy of our namesake Maccabees for generations. We

must honor that tradition of resolve in the face of this great adversity. Now, in this moment, Maccabi USA reaffirms our commitment to our core values: Athletic Excellence, Competition, Sportsmanship & Teamwork; Connection With Israel; Diversity & Inclusion; Jewish Continuity & Jewish Pride; The Power Of Sports To Build Community; and, Tikkun Olam: Lev L'Lev (Community Service).

Acting in accordance with this commitment we unwaveringly support Israel and the Jewish People, and, with unyielding determination, we affirm, "we are proud to be Jewish, proud to be Zionist, and proud to be Maccabi!"

One year ago, along with my husband and six suitcases, I landed in Philadelphia to begin a new journey.

That disaster completely altered our arrival here, and we found ourselves quite lost, filled with a sense of guilt for being so far from Israel, worried about our family and friends, and mostly in shock.

But this tragedy also made me realize that my role here was going to change, and the concept of my mission suddenly took on a much broader meaning. I'm not here to represent Israel; I'm here to remind everyone I meet along the way that Israel is our homeland, and if we don't defend it, and if we don't do everything to ensure its future, we won't have a place to return to.

In the past year, I found a home. I found real meaning, and I was fortunate enough to see how Jewish sports serve as a source of connection and pride for the Jewish communities in the U.S.

I am filled with pride to be part of this organization, and looking forward to another year where I can create, initiate and make an impact.
