More Than Ever.

As we put the finishing touches on Maccabi USA's preparations for this summer's meaningful edition of the Maccabiah, Maccabi World Union's tagline for the 2025 Games feels particularly apt.

More Than Ever, it's important that we show up.

Maccabi USA is doing just that. We are sending our largest-ever delegation of Junior athletes – nearly 500 in all, over 20% larger than our 2022 delegation. Maccabi World Union put the challenge out to countries around the world: bring a second squad in team sports such as baseball, basketball, ice hockey, soccer, volleyball, and futsal. And Maccabi USA answered their call. On the field of play, our two teams (blue and white) will compete against each other and teams from around the world. Off the field of play, nearly 150 additional teenagers will experience Israel and connect with Israelis and Jews from around the world, bringing the powerful experience back to their high school and college communities.

More Than Ever, it's important that we're together as a Jewish People.

This was evident at the 2023 Pan Am Maccabi Games, when the Maccabi Movement gathered less than three months after the October 7th attacks. The feeling of unity and solidarity was palpable in the arena in Buenos Aires at the Opening Ceremony and throughout those Games. Likewise at last summer's European Maccabi Youth Games in London. And now, as we prepare to gather for the 22nd Maccabiah, the Opening Ceremony at Teddy Stadium on July 10th will provide that same feeling of unity and be unlike any in a generation or more.

More Than Ever, it's important that we stand shoulder to shoulder with Israel.

At the annual Maccabi World Union Congress in March, our leadership heard first-hand from survivors of October 7th, released hostages, wounded soldiers, government leaders, and more. While their messages were unique, a consistent theme was their deep appreciation for our support and solidarity. It was clear how much our e presence meant to our Jewish sisters

mere presence meant to our Jewish sisters and brothers in this moment and how much our presence this summer will mean to all of Israel.

And, More Than Ever, it's important that Maccabi USA continues to build Jewish pride through sports.

These have been a challenging couple of years for Israel and Jews in America, to say the least. Our vision of a world where sports serve as a galvanizing force in strengthening Jewish pride, connection, and community is as relevant and as critical as it's ever been. We invite you to (re)commit to that vision by joining us in Israel this summer at the Maccabiah or following along from afar if you can't be there in person. Your support – showing up in person, online, or by making a donation - helps make that vision more of a reality for this and future generations of Jewish athletes. *Todah Rabah* - Thank You!


