Brian L. Roberts is Chairman and CEO of Comcast Corporation, a global media and technology company. Brian was named President [of Comcast] in 1990 when the company had \$657 million in annual revenue and served 2.4 million customers. Today, Comcast is a Fortune 35 company with more than 180,000 employees and \$124 billion in annual revenue. Under his leadership, Comcast has transformed through organic growth, new business innovations, and strategic acquisitions, including NBCUniversal in 2011 and Sky in 2018. Roberts has been recognized among Barron's "World's Best CEOs," Fortune's "Businessperson of the Year," and Institutional Investor's top U.S. CEOs, and is the recipient of honors such as the Simon Wiesenthal Center Humanitarian Award and the Yale Legend in Leadership Award.



An All-American squash player, Roberts has represented the United States six times at the Maccabiah Games in Israel, winning one gold and five silver medals. Honored by Maccabi USA as a "Legend of the Maccabiah," he has championed the sport's growth worldwide, helping establish the Arlen Specter US Squash Center in Philadelphia and supporting new facilities in Ra'anana, Israel. Roberts and Comcast NBCUniversal will also host squash's Olympic debut at the Comcast Squash Center at Universal Studios during the LA28 Olympic and Paralympic Games.
