CEO's Message

The Jewish People have a long history of being delayed on our journey to the Promised Land – and the 2025 Maccabiah certainly continued that tradition.

When Israel entered into direct conflict with Iran a mere two weeks before the Maccabi USA delegation was set to start arriving in Tel Aviv, the 2025 fate of the Games was quickly sealed. Our partners at Maccabi World Union made the tough but necessary decision to postpone the Maccabiah, as they had done four years earlier during those dizzying first few weeks of Covid. Of course, among the many differences between the two situations was this: back in 2021, we had 15 months to enact the postponement; this year, we had just 15 days.

I am grateful for our extraordinary team of dedicated professionals and volunteers who quickly sprang into action and oversaw the steps needed to navigate a sudden 12-month delay in our plans. For close to three years, that team diligently and enthusiastically helped form our delegation, team by team, athlete by athlete. Some likened the postponement to a marathon runner reaching mile marker 26 only to see an additional half-marathon had been tacked onto the end for good measure.

I am appreciative of our partners at Maccabi World Union whose athlete-focused ethos helped ensure a flexible approach that gave delegation members the chance to process the news and determine if the new timing in 2026 worked for them.

Likewise, we are grateful to our philanthropic supporters who, without exception, extended the timeframes of their grants so we could utilize their financial support a year later than planned.



It didn't take long for the disappointment of the postponement to turn into resolve to return next summer – bigger and better – inspired by the resilience of the Israeli People. A Maccabiah that was already going to be the most important and most meaningful in a generation (or more) would now be even more so.

In the meantime, thankfully, all the living hostages have been returned home as well as many more returned for proper burial. As this newsletter goes to print, we still await – and demand – the return of the bodies of two final hostages. We are hopeful that when our delegation arrives in Israel in June, the Ben Gurion arrival corridor will finally be empty of posters and that reservists will be home, signifying a new era of peace and security for Israel.

We invite you to join us for the (now) 2026 Maccabiah – as a competitor or spectator in the Promised Land itself or as supporter or streamer from the US – to bear witness to this threshold moment in Jewish history.
