President and CEO's *Message*

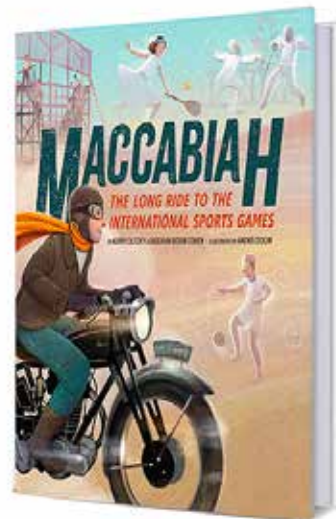
When Yosef Yuketeli was growing up in the early 20th Century Yishuv, he had a dream: to host an Olympic-style competition for Jewish athletes from around the world. Two decades later, he helped make that vision a reality by creating the first-ever Maccabiah in 1932 in what would soon become the State of Israel.

But when it came time to let Diaspora Jewish communities know about the Games, Yosef and the rest of the inaugural organizers were in a bind. Without the ease of modern-day communication, how would they spread the word to athletes and encourage travel to our people's ancient Homeland? They came up with a creative solution in the form of two separate motorcycle brigades they launched in 1930 and 1931 to help make Jews aware in Egypt and across Europe, respectively.

That story is now beautifully told in a wonderful new children's book *Maccabiah: The Long Ride to the International Sports Games* written by Kerry Olitzky and Deborah Bodin Cohen and illustrated by André Ceolin. Maccabi USA was proud to support Behrman House during the publishing process.

And thanks to PJ Library, an amazing program that provides free books to Jewish children, every 8-year-old who is signed up for PJ Library's monthly book deliveries received the "Maccabiah" book this spring.

Live Like Braun

Out of Tragedy, A Legacy of Hope and Opportunity

Maccabi USA is proud to announce the establishment of the Braun Levi LLB Memorial Fund. This scholarship endowment was created by Maccabiah parents Justine Stamen Arrillaga and John Arrillaga through the Arrillaga Foundation, in loving memory of Braun Levi, a close family friend. Braun was a beloved young tennis alum whose life was tragically cut short last year by a drunk driver. A Los Angeles native, Braun competed for Maccabi USA at the 2022 Maccabiah and was set to play tennis at the University of Virginia before his passing.

John Arrillaga and Braun’s father, Dr. Daniel Levi, have been long-time friends since attending Stanford. Reflecting on Braun, Justine shared that “he was an outstanding, beautiful, kind, fun, brilliant superstar human being and tennis player, and creating this endowment was a way to honor his legacy by helping future athletes experience the Games he cherished.”

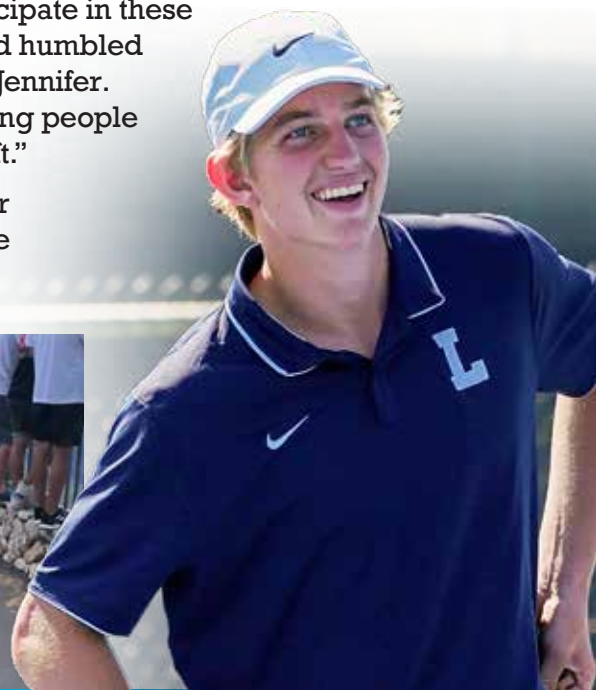
The Maccabiah had a profound influence on Braun, particularly in shaping his Jewish identity. Raised in an interfaith family, he found deep connection and pride while competing in Israel, including celebrating a B’nai Mitzvah with his sister Adelle (Maccabiah ’22, U18 Soccer) at the Wailing Wall.

Braun’s Maccabiah roommate, Grant Fisher, who knew him through the Los Angeles youth tennis circuit, recalled how fully Braun embraced the experience. “He dove in head-first—wearing a yarmulke, wrapping tefillin at the Wall, and making instant friends,” Grant said. “When he came home, he wanted to connect even more deeply with his Jewish roots.”

Following Braun’s passing, his parents, Dr. Daniel and Jennifer Levi, established the Live Like Braun Foundation to provide scholarships, rebuild public tennis centers, and raise awareness about the dangers of impaired driving. In less than a year, the foundation has gained widespread visibility. “It is truly incredible,” said Finn Arrillaga, a family friend of Braun’s and a Duke University swimmer who was also in the 2022 Maccabiah delegation. “I see Live Like Braun hats at every campus I travel to for swim meets.”

To honor Braun’s legacy, the Arrillaga family established his memorial fund at Maccabi USA to provide scholarships for teen athletes who otherwise could not afford to participate in these life-changing experiences. “We are incredibly thankful, inspired, and humbled by the Arrillagas’ creation of this endowment fund,” said his mother, Jennifer. “They are honoring Braun in the best way possible: By lifting our young people up and giving them a life-changing opportunity. There’s no better gift.”

Maccabi USA is deeply grateful to the Arrillaga and Levi families for honoring Braun’s memory and continuing to make a lasting, positive impact on the community.
